H2 Why build a gunpowder works at Oare?


Read the following information about the siting of gunpowder works.

...because of the risk of explosion, most sites were in <u>remote locations</u> and used <u>water to drive the equipment</u>. As charcoal was a main ingredient, many of the sites were <u>wooded</u> to provide raw materials. <u>Buildings were well</u> <u>spaced out</u>, often in a long line, and many were surrounded with blast banks.

Another source states these features are necessary for a successful manufacturing works.

- Water from a stream to drive machinery
- Trees to make charcoal and absorb blast from accidental explosions
- Plenty of people to work (from a nearby village)
- A sheltered creek where raw materials could be brought in and gunpowder shipped out
- A use for the gunpowder. Gunships used to sail from The Naval Dockyard at Chatham
